Dear Families and Friends,
I can't believe we're at the beginning of another school season and into our **9th year** of welcoming children and families!

We know that teaching and learning in early childhood settings is a relationship-based processes. We study and cultivate relationships and listen to the children. Development is not possible without relationships.

As we begin this fall, I would like to make visible in this edition of our newsletter just a few of the many intentions and efforts directed towards the creation our "amiable school" through relationships that in turn create a sense of community.

At Building Blocks Preschool we go about building a sense of community and a sense of place for children, parents, and teachers such that teaching and learning achieve a higher level of results.

Here are several examples leading up to the start of the school year that enable us to achieve a sense of community and build relationships: parent tours and orientation meetings, indoor and outdoor environments that invite children to engage with materials, activities, and with one another, focusing on teacher's strengths, professional development experiences, documentation, learning stories, family photos, small group

work, and dialogue about the image of the child who seeks relationships and construct understandings. The list is long and purposeful. One element can become an opening to another, allowing us to access the system of relationships from many entry points.

Throughout this newsletter we highlight our special learning community. The time together combining social and professional experiences will, we believe, enhance the quality of our collaboration as a group of educators and deliver high quality Early Childhood Education.

I share all of this to give you insight into some of the "behind the scenes" relationship-building intentions and strategies that took place before the start of the school year. We packed in a lot of professional development and preparation in those weeks in August. And now, you and your children have arrived to complete the company of protagonists. As Ms. Jen commented just before the first day of school, "It is time, we are ready for the children to come."

We look forward to our collaboration with you and the children this school year. Being together we will create an "amiable school" where teaching and learning thrive in all of our spaces.

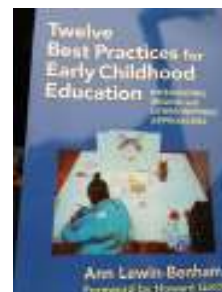
Supporting Teachers in an Early Childhood Learning Community

In this section I would like to explain our purpose for supporting teacher relationships, professional development, and collaboration between teachers. Building Blocks Preschool is an active steering committee member of Michigan Inspirations. A group of Reggio Inspired educators here in Michigan. We are going into our third year and have created a professional learning community. In August, Building Blocks teachers partnered with the University of Michigan to form a collaborative



study of Reggio Inspired classrooms. Teachers from both schools observed and studied each others techniques, documentation and environments. Thank you to Jennifer and Jen for being the first to participating in the teacher swap.

Our goal this year is to create inspiring environments. This is visible in all our classrooms. In August, all our teachers met for our professional development day. Our Book Study for this



year is Twelve Best Practices for Early Childhood Education, by Ann Lewin-Benham.

Our first step was to go into each of our classrooms and do an

EXCEL Self-Assessment. This is a tool for reflection on our practice.

We will be collaborating as a small group along with our Michigan Inspiration Collaborative over the next 10 months.

All our teachers have received the book

StrengthsFinder 2.0 by Tom Rath and took the Gardner assessment that in-



cluded a personalized strengths insight and we reviewed our teams strength summary report. We have a diverse set of strengths with a high majority in Relationships quadrant. This brings great value and insight that are embedded in our work with children and families.

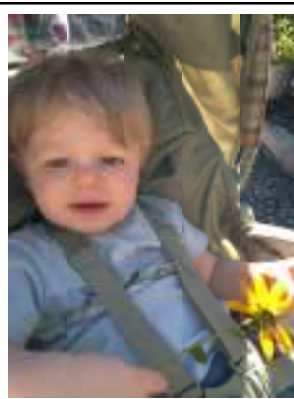
The first weeks of school are filled with freshness. Some children and
